deCoste Centre for Arts and Creativity

The deCoste Centre for Arts and Creativity will host a cluster of arts and community organizations and activities in one building. As we all age and rural populations get smaller, it makes good sense to bring organizations together to share facilities.


Why?

- Organizations spend less on operating costs and overheads and more on their services to the community.
- Traffic is pooled. If 2,000 residents use the library each week, that is 2,000 sets of eyes that see posters and promo in the building for upcoming shows. The same works in reverse, with show attendees learning about library programs.
- A facility like this helps to recruit families to our region, not just workers, and helps with employee retention.

A Joint Vision, Patience, and Persistence

Eight years ago, the Town of Pictou asked the deCoste and Pictou Antigonish Regional Library Boards to consider creating a vision to bring both organizations together in a modern new building. The deCoste had many age and growth-related needs (more washrooms, lobby space, parking, etc.). The current library, housed in the Town of Pictou municipal building is dated, lacks adequate program space, and is not fully accessible. The advantages were quickly identified, and an exciting vision quickly emerged.

This once-in-a-generation project more than doubles the current square footage. The new design allows for much more to happen under one roof enhancing the sustainability of all the partner organizations in the long term.





What Can You Expect?

The Building will:

- bring together a full-scale performing arts centre, modern public library, enhanced meeting/event space, art production and exhibition spaces.
- welcome patrons with bold glass facades from both Water Street and the waterfront.
- greatly expanded library programs and services with exciting new book collections, public
 access to technology resources, opportunities for collaborative programming and multiple
 gathering and meeting spaces.
- feature an expanded Murray Room, and adjoining community room, with a kitchenette.
- showcase of over 20 public art elements commissioned from a diverse mix of artists.
- feature a completely refreshed theatre space with new seating, carpet, and many audio/lighting video enhancements.
- be built to net-zero-carbon-ready status, with a large roof-top solar array and multiple energy-conserving systems and technologies in use.
- be built with many accessibility-enhancing systems and features in place.
- include enhancements to the site such as street and harbour patios, a harbour boardwalk, improved and accessible parking, pedestrian-level lighting, and electric vehicle chargers.

A much broader mix of activities:

This new building will empower both the deCoste and the library to expand their programs and user base. Partnerships will flourish and new programs and services will be launched. One need only visit award-winning libraries in Antigonish and Halifax to see just how diverse the activities can be.

This is not the library of your grandparent's era. It is an exciting hub of activity for the whole community that will enhance our quality of life for a generation. It is now months, not years until the facility is completed and reopens.






