

This is the 30th Anniversary of the recognition service held to honour the memory of the No. 2 Construction Battalion C.E.F., Canada's first and only all-Black regiment during World War I, established in 1916: 107 years ago, along the shores of Pictou, Join us as we commemorate these historically important individuals in our country's war story starting with an honorary parade travelling eastbound along Caladh Avenue beginning at the Black Battalion Monument located on Market Street, to Creighton St., ending at the Caladh Marquee for a ceremony which will include descendants, elected officials, the Minister of Defence, and the Commander of the Army. Historic displays and a replica monument will be on display at the event tent and first-person narratives of soldier stories will be shared.



DeeDee Austin is a 16-year-old Indigenous singer/songwriter and member of the Abegweit First Nation. DeeDee's infectious energy and authentic songwriting are bringing her recognition across the Maritimes. Of the four 2022 Music NS Award categories that Austin was nominated for, she won two: Indigenous Artist and New Recording Artist of the Year. She was inspired to pursue a music career by her church organist, the late Maxine Hibbits. and draws much inspiration from a deep pride in her Indigenous roots.

In addition to an appearance this year at Stanfest, this busy young artist has recently performed for the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation, the Halifax Jazz Fest, NS Mi'kmaw Summer Games in Cape Breton, and the Lunenburg Folk Harbour Fest. "My goal is to touch the hearts of all my listeners through my lyrics. I pour my heart into everything that I sing and play!"

250th Anniversary of the Ship Hector Landing in Pictou, NS

September 15, 2023 will rank as one of the most important dates in Canadian history because it marks the 250th anniversary of the arrival of the Ship Hector in Pictou, Nova Scotia. The Hector was the first ship that brought emigrants directly from Scotland to Nova Scotia in 1773. The 189 Highlanders endured a harrowing voyage to start a new life in a new land. Those who arrived aboard the Hector, as well as those Scottish settlers who followed, made enormous cultural, political, intellectual, and industrial contributions that shaped Nova Scotia and the rest of Canada.

Planned activities to commemorate the historical event include a sailing regatta, Bluenose II deck tours, the original musical The Voyage, Gaelic and Indigenous culture and music, the Hector Ceilidh, and the Hector Tattoo. A major component of the weekend will be the unveiling and first opportunity to see the restoration progress on the Hector. Visitors will be able to step aboard the ship, which is currently on blocks in the yard, experience the below-deck atmosphere, and walk along the newly finished upper decks. Members of the restoration team will be on hand to explain the process of the restoration to date.

The Charting Our Course campaign, which is funding the restoration, has raised over \$1.8 million for the ship. Community and corporate support will help us achieve our target of \$2.5 million to complete the project. Once fully restored the Hector will be able to do tours of Pictou Harbour. It will be the only tall ship in Canada powered by solar energy and many other 'green energy' features.

The Society is also leading a major project which will see a complete update and renovation of the Interpretive Centre. The face-lift includes a new roof and public areas, innovative and interactive displays and a more thorough telling of the partnership of the Scottish settlers and the Indigenous people of Pik'tuk. The entire site and ship will be fully powered by solar panels and will be a leader in using green technology in public spaces.




