The deCoste believes that the arts are an integral part of our lives, and that everyone has the right to access and experience the magical world of the

performing arts.



During our latest expansion and upgrades, creating a barrier-free environment was a priority. Our new facility now features external and internal ramps, mechanical lifts, barrier-free washrooms, more accessible parking, a drop-off point, and an enhanced hearing-assist system.

In addition to facility improvements, we continue our Arts for All vision. We know that attending an event or show at a theatre is an experience not everyone feels is accessible, and we are working to change that. Partnering with community groups, we identify and reduce barriers—physical (vision, mobility, hearing), social, or economic—to create a welcoming space for all.

We encourage community organizations to contact us about accessibility needs. Together, we design programs to address them. Examples include:

- Partnering with Pictou-Antigonish Regional Library to loan passes for select shows.
- Welcoming Highland Community Residential Services staff and residents to performances.
- Offering hearing system guidance, lift assistance, or accessibility tours upon request.

True accessibility is a journey, not a destination. We value feedback and will continue improving our facility.

See Art - Feel Art - Hear Art

In Canada, 40% of people over 40 experience some degree of hearing loss. Our new facility includes assistive technology at the circulation desk, in the theatre, and a portable system for use anywhere in the culture hub. In the theatre, audio from the PA system is transmitted directly to your hearing aid or a receiver with headphones. Portable receivers are free but limited, so we recommend booking in advance when purchasing tickets or through the box office. The Pictou Cultural Hub & Accessible Hearing Solutions:

A Partnership to Reduce Barriers for People Living with Hearing Loss in the Community

In the heart of a picturesque Pictou, Nova Scotia, a groundbreaking cultural hub has opened its doors, blending the best of performance arts and literary treasures. The hub includes the deCoste Performance Arts Centre and the Murray Family Public Library. This state-of-the-art facility is not just a celebration of culture but also a shining example of inclusivity, thanks to its innovative approach to accessibility. Designed to serve as a community anchor, this facility provides residents and visitors a space to gather, learn, and be inspired.

What sets this cultural hub apart is its unwavering commitment to accessibility. Recognizing the barriers faced by individuals who are hard of hearing, the municipality partnered with **Accessible Hearing Solutions**, a technological partner with the Canadian Hard of Hearing Association and the leading provider of assistive listening technologies in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. Hearing loop systems were installed throughout the facility. Also known as induction loops, they use electromagnetic signals to transmit sound directly to hearing aids and cochlear implants equipped with telecoils. This technology dramatically improves sound clarity by reducing background noise, making it easier for individuals to engage fully with performances, presentations, and conversations.



In the library, counter hearing loops were installed at the information desks. Phonak sound field systems are now available for meeting rooms and community events, improving the sound experience through the use of microphones, speakers, and assistive listeners with hearing loop technology or headphones for those who need help but do not wear hearing aids. In the theatre, a Phonak DM/FM system was added to the theatre's sound system, allowing patrons who are hard of hearing to enjoy plays, concerts, and lectures by directly



connecting their hearing aids and cochlear implants to the sound system. This can be done either through the use of an assistive listener with headphones or telecoils, or directly without an assistive listener if they have hearing devices that are Phonak Roger X (02) compatible.



"When we started on this journey towards broader accessibility, we had a lot to learn. We thought first of visible physical disabilities amongst our patrons. Our first projects involved lifts and ramps. The need for hearing assist technologies is massive, in all public facilities, not just cultural. Our average patron is 50+ and many have hearing challenges. There isn't another area of accessibility improvement we could embrace that will impact more of our patrons. Janine and her team facilitated our project in so many ways, from needs assessment to education to securing funding to installation. Now that the technology is in place, she and the team will help us introduce it to our community.

The collaboration with Accessible Hearing Solutions was instrumental in bringing this vision to life. The company provided not only the technology but also comprehensive training for staff, ensuring they can assist patrons in making the most of the hearing loops and assistive listening technology. This partnership underscores the Pictou Cultural Hub's broader mission to break down barriers and create a truly inclusive space for everyone." — Troy Greencorn, deCoste Performing Arts Centre

By combining the richness of culture with the principles of accessibility, it demonstrates that progress and inclusivity can go hand in hand. This innovative facility is not just a testament to the transformative power of the arts and literature but also a reminder that true community thrives when everyone has the opportunity to participate fully.



Members can put tickets "on hold" and pay for the performance 2 weeks before the performance, or release the hold.





What To Expect Upon Arrival

While experiencing live entertainment is very exciting, coming to a new and unfamiliar place can be a little bit daunting. We hope this diagram will help you find your way around.



Here are a few tips to make your arrival go smoothly:

- Arrive early enough to get a good parking spot, or if you have General Admission tickets, to get a good seat.
- Our box office doors and auditorium doors open an hour and a 1/2 hour, respectively, before show time.
- Use the main entrance to pick up tickets at the box office.
- Use either entrance if you already have tickets. TIP: The one at the top of the stairs is closest to the auditorium.
- Washrooms are located in the hall across from the auditorium bar. Ladies go left | Gents go right | Gender-neutral - go straight ahead.
- The concession stand opens an hour before shows and during intermissions. Items can be brought into the auditorium for your enjoyment (please dispose of garbage at the end of the event).
